Brown Early Childhood Center Faculty and staff believe all children can learn!

Children and learning are our top priorities! Students are assessed and test results are used to drive instruction. Kindergarten students have a ninety-minute reading block, thirty-minute reading intervention time, sixty minute math and designated discovery and center times.

Equally important is reading books, interactive and modeled writing, science, social studies, and opportunities for kinesthetic learning (seeing, hearing, doing, and whole body movement in learning). Children learn a great deal during P.E., recess, music, library, and computer lab times as well.
